Dear Parishioners,

At the Marriage Feast at Cana, it was Mary who noticed that they had run out of wine. When she mentioned this to Jesus, he seemed reluctant to get involved. It is probably an indication of the special bond between Mother and Son that she was able to ignore his protests and instruct the servants to do whatever Jesus told them to do. He proceeded to give the first of his 'signs.' He told the servants to fill six stone jars with water. Each of those jars could hold the equivalent of more than 100 wine bottles. When a sample was brought to the steward to taste, he declared that they had kept the best wine until last! There was quality as well as quantity in what Jesus offered them.

The special bond between Mary and Jesus reminds us that we can turn to Mary to seek her help for our needs. But we also have to bear in mind the instruction that Mary gave to the servants at that wedding feast. She told them to do whatever Jesus asked them to do. As we look to the Lord for help with all our needs, we have to be prepared to use the resources that God has entrusted to us, knowing that the efforts that we make to support each other will always be magnified by the graces that God offers to each one of us, for the benefit of all.

Pax Christi – This Sunday is Peace Sunday. Pax Christi is a Catholic Movement for Peace in England and Wales, based on the Gospel and inspired by faith. SPUC White Flower Appeal – The Society for the Protection of Unborn Children (SPUC) is currently campaigning to protect pro-life speech. Pro-life witness is being restricted now more than ever; the ability to speak freely is necessary to protect unborn babies. There is a designated wall-box in the main porch of the church in which you can make a donation for the work of SPUC. You can also donate online, or sign their petition to protect free speech, at spuc.org.uk.

There is also a civic service organised by Barnet Council on Sunday 23rd January at 3pm at Rickett Quadrangle, Middlesex University, The Burroughs, Hendon NW4 4BT, details of which are at barnet.gov.uk/holocaust.

Honouring Sunday – Uncertainty about the direction that the coronavirus is going to take causes many people to hesitate about sharing in the Sunday Mass. The Bishops of England and Wales have acknowledged that fact, but encourage all Catholics to reflect on how we mark the Lord's Day. Churches Together in Prayer – A Service for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity will take place on Tuesday (18th January) at 8pm, at All Saints Church, 35a Durham Road, East Finchley, N2 9DP. All are welcome.

Foreign Coins – If you have any foreign coins that you no longer need, or any coins that have ceased to be legal tender, you can place them in the designated wall-box in the main porch (near the Repository door). They will be passed onto the North London Hospice to support their work of palliative and end-of-life care.

Lost Property – Have you left personal items behind in the church in the past few months? The lost property basket in the church porch is now overflowing with clothing and other items that have been abandoned in the church. Have a look to see if there is anything belonging to you. If items are not claimed in the coming weeks, a new home will be found for them.
