22nd Sunday of the Year – 30th August 2020

Dear Parishioners,

The prophet Jeremiah comes across as being a sensitive man. He found his mission of being a prophet a burdensome one. In today's first reading, he effectively calls God a bully for the demands that are being made of him. But he follows that accusation by reflecting on how doing what God asked of him brought a warm glow to his heart. He was torn between his desire to walk away and his need to fulfil his vocation.

Simon Peter, who had just been described by Jesus as the 'rock', becomes a stumbling block in today's Gospel reading. Like Jeremiah, Peter feels inclined not to take the painful path, and tries to talk Jesus out of following the path of suffering and death. The response he receives from Jesus may seem a bit harsh, but the message Peter needed to hear was that he shouldn't stand in the way of Christ's mission, but rather he should try to follow in Christ's footsteps.

Peter and Jeremiah both learned the lesson that the easy path was not the path that leads to a sense of fulfilment. The way to build up our share of the things of this world is to hoard them and keep them to ourselves. The way in which we increase spiritual gifts is the opposite. The more we are able to give away the gift of love to others, the more that gift is magnified for the benefit of all.

Booking for Mass – As we have to ensure that the number of people in the church building remains within safe limits, it is advisable to register your intention to come to a particular Sunday Mass. The simplest way to book for Mass is via the Events page on the parish microsite at <https://parish.rcdow.org.uk/finchleychurchend/events/>.

Choose the Mass you wish to attend and click on the 'Book a Place' button for that Mass. Then enter your name and either a phone number or an email address. Only one booking is required for each household group of up to five people, but specify how many people are in the group. Make sure you complete your booking by clicking on the green button at the bottom of the page. You should then

receive an on-screen confirmation. If you are unable to access the online service, you can also book with a phone call to the parish number, or in writing, saying which Mass you wish to attend and providing contact details. The information supplied will be deleted automatically 21 days after the date of the Mass for which you book. There are currently no booking arrangements for weekday Masses, including Saturday morning. Those who turn up without booking will be admitted to any of the Masses if un-booked places are still available in the church.

Those who attend a Sunday Mass on their own, or with one or two other members of the same household, are invited to use the chairs at the sides of the church, to leave more space in the benches for larger family groups to sit together.

The mandatory wearing of face coverings means that there is scope to increase the capacity of the church, but we are aiming to maintain a 2-metre separation between people from different households for the time being.

Sacramental Programmes – As children head back to school this week, we are making arrangements for the children who were due to make their First Holy Communion in June. The plan is for the children to receive their First Holy Communion in three different groups on Saturday mornings in October. There will be a limit to the number of family members and others who can join the children for the liturgy. Details are being sent to parents by email, so look out for that message, and let us know if you don't receive it. We are hoping to begin the new First Holy Communion course in January. More information about that will be available after the half-term break. Information about the arrangements for Confirmation will be provided as soon as possible.

Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confessions) – Confessions currently take place on Saturday mornings between 10:30-11:00am in the Weekday Chapel. Enter the Chapel via the door near the side entrance of the church. While awaiting your turn for Confession, please remain in the main body of the church, keeping an appropriate distance from others. A face covering should be worn while you are in the church building.

Planned Giving – Many thanks to those who have been making payments to the parish account. Standing Orders, as well as one-off payments, can be set up using mobile or online banking. The account name to use is 'WRCDT Finchley Church End', sort code 40-05-20, account number 11094599. (It is classed as a 'business' account.) If you prefer to make your offering by cheque, please make it payable to "WRCDT St Philip the Apostle Finchley." Donations are all recorded against the date of receipt, rather than the date on your envelope, so only one envelope is required each time you make a donation, even if it is for several weeks. There is no offertory collection at present, but boxes are available in the church in which you can deposit your envelope or other offerings when you come to a Sunday Mass. There is also a wall box in the main porch marked for donations. You can now also donate to the parish using Virgin Money Giving (VMG) – there are links to our VMG donation page on the parish websites.

Tax Refunds – If you pay tax, whether it is on salary, pension, savings or investments, we can reclaim the tax you pay on the money you donate to the church. All you have to do is to complete a Gift Aid declaration and then make your offerings, either by numbered envelope, by cheque or directly to the parish bank account. If you haven't already done so, please consider signing up. You can now also register for Gift Aid by email. <https://parish.rcdow.org.uk/finchleychurchend/donate/> provides details of what is required.

If you are admitted to hospital, and you would like to see a Catholic Chaplain, data protection rules require you to tell the hospital staff, firstly, that you wish your details to be passed to the RC Chaplain and, secondly, that you would like the RC Chaplain to visit you.

Radio Broadcasts – Those who are unable to access live-streaming on the internet can listen to Mass on DAB radio. Radio Maria England broadcasts on DAB+ in the London area. (Search for RMariaEn.) They have Mass each day after the Angelus at 12 noon, as well as earlier Masses at different times. See <https://radiomariaengland.uk/> for details.

Parish Registration – Have you registered with the Parish? Have you changed your address since you registered? It is helpful, if you need any kind of reference, if you are already on our parish database. Our parish database is held securely on computer and contains only the information you provide to us. That information is never shared with any third party, unless you give your express consent. If you leave the parish, or no longer wish to be included on the database, you can let us know at any time and your information will be deleted. If you need to register, or update your details, or are not sure if you have

registered, you can request a registration form by email. (Make a note on the top of the form if you are updating details.)
